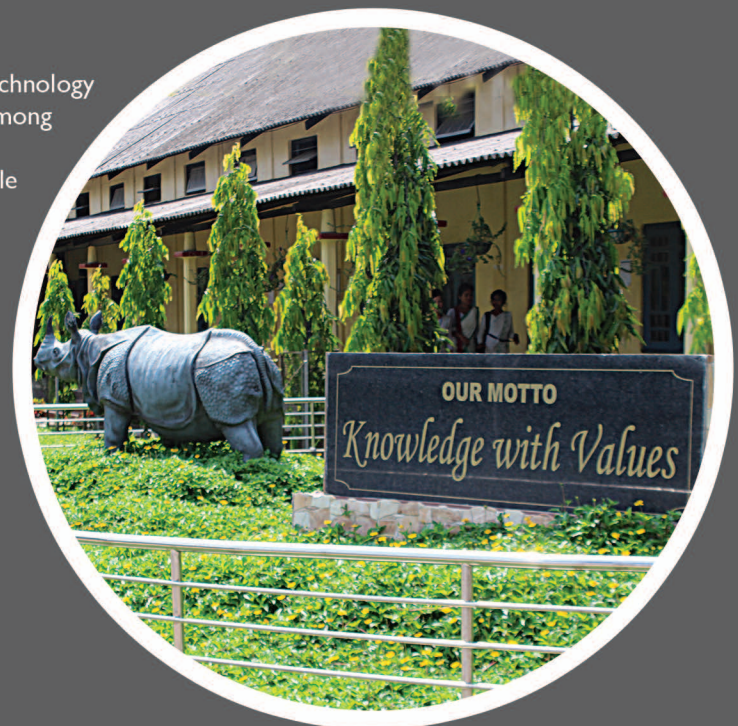

Ambience

Sylvan surroundings marked by an ashram-like serenity and calmness is the hallmark of the teaching-learning environment of the college. The guarded entrance further secures the congenial atmosphere for effective teaching-learning practice. For the all-round development of the personality of the learner, the College is endowed with sprawling playfields and clean and green campus. Another feature that adds to the ambience is the aesthetically planned flower gardens which are interspersed around the landscape of the campus. There are adequate academic and physical resources to cater to the needs and aspirations of the student community. Each core subject in the Course Programme has departmental assets such as common room, library and computerized resource centre. Core subjects having practical components are facilitated with well-attended laboratories with ample resources to run tests, experiments and demonstrations. Traditional classrooms and lecture halls are ably complemented by IT-enabled





Administrative Block

For office work related to student enrolment, conduct of classes, holding of examinations, etc., there is a well-equipped administrative block. It serves as the nerve centre of the College because it is from here that the principal's office operates along with an adequate number of office staff. The computerized accounts section and general branch of the office are housed in the administrative block in order to issue and receive all necessary documents, bills, orders and circulars. The administrative block also features the information zone in which the periodically issued original office communications are displayed prominently.

College Library

The College Library is situated in a formidable multi-storied building. Currently operating from the ground floor, the library has a well-furnished reading room and a reference section. Plans are afoot to move the reference section to the first floor in the current academic session. The library has a vast collection of text books, journals, magazines and newspapers. To help readers keep abreast of the goings-on in the field of academics and current affairs, 26 journals of national and international repute, periodicals and leading magazines and newspapers of national and global importance are regularly subscribed by the Library. The Library provides space for reading for both teachers and students and remains open from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on all working days. Students are allowed to borrow sufficient number of books on production of the library card for 15 days from the date of issue. Users are also provided with photocopy facilities in the library. There is provision for internet use free of cost for interested scholars inside the Library. Students belonging to the BPL category can borrow two books from the Library for the whole academic session. There is also a provision of poor fund providing free books to economically underprivileged students of the College.



Canteen

The brand new, double-storied College canteen has become a source of pride for both the alumni, faculty and other members of the College fraternity. It is by common consent one of the most impressive College canteens around in terms of its structural strength as well as its décor, furnishing and overall quality. The self-service, cleanliness and safe drinking water facility in the canteen attract hordes of students and faculty to the canteen where multi-cuisine snacks and meals can be partaken of.

Hostel

There are two multi-storied hostels, one each for girls and boys in the College campus. The College offers hostel accommodation to students on a need-based principle. Admission to the hostels is allowed on the basis of percentage of marks as well as from the distance from the applicant's residence to the College. The boys' hostel has 40 seats whereas the girls' hostel has 50 seats presently. The hostels are well-guarded with boundary walls, round-the-clock security, 24 hour water and power supply apart from strict supervision from a resident faculty member. It must be born in mind that for hostel admissions, separate forms are issued once the student is admitted into any of the Course Programmes of the College.





Sports Complex

The College has a strong culture of sports activities with particular emphasis on football, volleyball, basketball, hockey and cricket. The College playground has been host to many state-level students' meets and has produced scores of state and national level players.

To add to this, a new Integrated Sports Complex has come up in the College with emphasis on badminton and volleyball training facilities. For all-round sports development, a multi-gym facility is also in place in the College premises.



Auditorium

The College Auditorium is an important asset which has been witness to many academic and cultural events including The Annual Prize Distribution Ceremony, Freshers' Social, Teachers' Day, College Foundation Day, Science Day, Science Festival Workshop and so on. During examinations, the Auditorium doubles up as Examination Hall.



Biotech Hub

The Hub has been established with the sponsorship and liberal grants from the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India. The objective of the Hub is to make the emerging field of Biotechnology an attractive career option for science students. The Hub also serves as instrumentation facility for biotechnology research and development activities. It is under the Hub that a three-year professional course is being run in the College.



Conference Hall

For academic presentations, lectures and convocation addresses to august audience apart from intense audio-visual exchanges, a state-of-the-art conference hall is at the disposal of the College. The acoustically sound, air-conditioned conference hall serves as the venue of the most important events within the academic session in the College.



Orchidarium

In order to preserve and propagate a vast number of orchid species available in the region, the Orchidarium has been serving an important function in the academic and corporate life of the College. As many as 38 species of orchids collected from the Nagaon district of Assam have been preserved in the Orchidarium. Besides, quite a few exotic species of orchids are also in the pride possession of the Orchidarium.



Placement Cell

Students looking for job placements as well as admission into higher institutions are provided necessary motivational personality development training programmes by the Cell. Important notices, application forms and prospectus for jobs and admission programmes are brought to the notice of the students with inputs as to how to go about these are also provided by the Cell.

Cultural Museum

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

HOW TO APPLY

Application for admission must be made in prescribed form enclosed with the prospectus which can be procured from the College on payment of Rs. 100/- only. The Admission Form can be downloaded from www.kaliaborcollege.org. In such cases candidate have to submit a Bank Draft of Rs. 100/- drawn in favour of 'Principal, Kaliabor College' payable at AGVB, Kuwaritol, Nagaon. Candidates are asked to read prospectus carefully before or while filling the Admission Form.

 - a) Self attested Photo copy of Mark sheet and Certificate from HSLC onwards.
 - b) Photo copy of the Character & Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended. (Not applicable for students passed out from Kaliabor College)
 - c) Photo copy of the Matriculation Admit Card,
 - d) Photo copy of Caste Certificate/ Certificate for Physically Handicap/ Court Affidavit or Certificate from the Institution last attended for gap period in studies/ Income Certificate in case of O.B.C. candidates/ Certificate for Extracurricular activities for claim of seat
 - e) Bank Draft of Rs. 100/- if Admission Form is downloaded,

COLLECTION OF FEES

All fees are collected through Assam Gramin Vikash Bank, Kuwaritol Branch. Students are required to prepare challan in triplicate in prescribed form for making payment of fees. The first copy of the challan is retained by the bank. The second copy of the same is required to be produced before the Cash Counter of the college. On receipt of the same the college furnishes its own Receipt acknowledging the receipt of fees. The third copy of the challan is to be retained by the student concerned for future reference.

RESERVATION

Reservation for SC, ST (Plains), ST (Hills), OBC and MOBC students will be as per Govt. rules. In addition 5% of total seats will be reserved for those students who have proficiency in sports, NCC, NSS, Scout and cultural activities. Applications of the students from land donors' family and the applications from the students having none of the parents or only one of the parents alive will also be considered in this category.

STUDENTS SEEKING ADMISSION AGAINST RESERVED QUOTA WILL HAVE TO SUBMIT PHOTOCOPIES OF RELEVANT CERTIFICATES COUNTERSIGNED BY COMPETENT AUTHORITY ALONG WITH THEIR APPLICATION FORMS. OTHERWISE THEIR CASES WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

DOCUMENTS TO BE PRODUCED AT THE TIME OF INTERVIEW :

The originals of all the documents photocopies of which are attached with the application form and the counter foil of the admission form.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

Candidates are selected for admission into H. S. and Three Year Degree Courses in order of merit. After the scrutiny of the forms by the admission committee a list of selected candidates will be prepared in order of merit and the same will be displayed in the college Notice Board. The selected candidates must appear personally before an interview board on date fixed by the admission committee and produce all the original documents photocopies of which are submitted with the Admission Form. Any request or prayer in any kinds for admission after the date fixed for interview will not be entertained and candidates unable to attend personally and produce original documents on the date of interview will not be admitted later on. While preparing the merit list 'Reservation system' is followed as per Government Rules. Decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission shall be final.

ENTRANCE TEST

Major will be given on Merit Basis. Entrance Test will be held for Major Course in Assamese, Political Science, Education, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology. The criterion is : % HS + % Subject + Marks of Entrance Test. For Major in other Subjects criterion is % HS + % Subjects. 10 marks additional will be given to students with Elective Assamese. For Assamese Major and the Alternative English for English Major. 20% Seat will be reserved for student of Kaliabor College. No Reservation policy for Major course.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students admitted to the College must adhere to the rules and regulations laid down by the College. Violation of the rules, unruly conduct and indiscipline, disrespect shown to the authority, faculty and staff as well as seniors will be severely dealt with. Ragging in any form or manner will be strictly punished.

Rules during Examinations:

A student must appear in all internal examinations conducted by the Internal Examination Board of the College. Failure to appear in the internal examinations will lead to strict action by the College authorities. Failure to present proper documents like admit cards may lead to action which may be initiated by the Examination Board. Unruly behavior, adoption of unfair means in the examination hall and unnecessary argument on the part of the examinee may lead to expulsion from the examination hall. Since use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the campus during examinations, secret use of mobile phones in the examination hall will lead to expulsion.

GENERAL RULES

A student cannot organize gatherings, meetings and demonstrations without the prior permission of the College authorities. Only recognized students' bodies (like the duly elected Students' Union) will have the right of representation in student related issues. Such gatherings, meetings and demonstrations will be considered irregular and strict action may be taken in such matters. Formation of students' forums, societies and associations etc., initiated by the students must come under the supervision of the College authorities.

STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Union of Kaliabor College is the democratically elected students' representative body. The general election to the Students' Union is conducted under the strict observance of the Lingdoh Commission guidelines. An Election Commission comprising of the faculty members is formed by the College authorities in order to conduct smooth, free and fair election. As potential leaders of the society, the spirit of democratic representation is instilled in the minds of the students of the College. In the day-to-day conduct of the Students' Union, a fully furnished room is allotted to the student representatives. Besides organizing student events, the Union is also entrusted with organizing annual sports and cultural events. Annual issue of students' magazine is also brought out by the Union. NSS:

The National Service Scheme has a membership of 100 students in the College. Instrumental in the awareness drives related to social causes like blood donation, drive against substance abuse, cleanliness drive, street plays highlighting the evil practice of witch-hunting and how to fight it, the Kaliabor College NSS team has been commendably rendering its services in the locality.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Students once enrolled into the College share a life-long relationship with their alma mater. In order to strengthen their relationship with the institution, a vibrant Alumni Association is in place. Among the many roles that the Alumni Association assumes is its participation in the major activities of the College.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

The College strictly adheres to a uniform dress code. Students inside the College campus must be in uniform. Violation of the dress code will summarily lead to expulsion from the campus with immediate effect. The dress code is as follows:

Boys: White shirt and black formal trousers (Jeans trousers are strictly forbidden) and maroon pullovers or sweaters (for winter).

Girls: Muga-coloured plain mekhala, air hostess type white blouse, white chadar with green border line and deep green sweater.

or

White salwar kameej and green Jaipuri print dupatta or bandhni. Maroon pullovers or sweaters for winter (leggings and Patiala salwars are strictly forbidden)

IDENTITY CARD

A Student must carry identity card at all times in the College campus. The computer-generated identity card, issued at the time of admission must be produced as and when demanded by the authority or security personnel. In the event of the loss of an identity card, a duplicate copy of the Card is issued against a payment of Rs. 100/-.

ATTENDANCE

A student must attend a minimum of 75% classes in an academic session. Students failing to attend 75% classes will not be allowed to appear in the final examination or end-term examination. A student who is unable to attend classes must produce a leave note forwarded by the class teacher to the Vice Principal's office. Leave notes or applications must be furnished with credible reasons and medical or other documents. The College reserves the right to disqualify a student who fails to attend classes for a long stretch of time without a leave note or permission of the College authorities.
